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The Case for Cross-Sector Co-Design

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Growing recognition about the importance of addressing health related social needs (HRSN) non-medical drivers of health.



Successful coordination and alignment of health and social care requires codesigned delivery systems that center the community.



Effective, sustainable partnerships between CBOs and health care can be facilitated through a Community Care Hub (CCH).



Advocate for and operationalize opportunities to adopt CCH as vital partner to organize and support a network of CBOs providing services to address HRSNs.



- USAging received additional funding from Margaret A. Cargill Philanthropies to explore the benefits, challenges, and needs for CCH development in rural areas







Key Informant Interviews

- 2024 USAging Conference Kick-Off and Roundtable informed interview guide and process
- 24 interviews with 44 individuals across 20 states
- All have rural areas, but around 30% were *predominately* rural
